

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JANUARY

MARY, MOTHER OF GOD (Octave of Christmas) DATE: 01/01/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **THE MESSAGE OF GOD IS TRUTH**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Luke 2: 16-21**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

In a sophisticated school, the students were arrogant and full of pride, they didn't like to be associated with the non-teaching staff. They hardly greet them, especially the cleaners, the students believed they should be at their mercies just because they have wealthy parents and those ones are lowly. *So, what's the connection and relationship that should exist between them?* The school management has tried to correct this erroneous notion of theirs but they never yielded. 'Lade was different, she was brought up well and believed she was only opportune and God's grace at work that made her come from a wealthy home. Nevertheless, we all are humans, so she didn't showcase the bitterness of discrimination unlike others. To their greatest surprise, one of their compulsory theory questions with the highest mark in Civic Education was; "Mention the name of your class cleaner?" straightforward but brain racking questions, the students were sweating profusely because they had seen her and they could describe her but they didn't and never wanted to know anything about any of them. Out of the whole school, it was only 'Lade that got it Mrs. Bassey (Mummy Blessing). This question taught them no one is insignificant in life. We should always be hospitable, show attention and care to others. They never forgot this

lesson in a hurry because it cost them ample amount of mark. They immediately met the cleaners after the examination to apologise, introduce themselves and get their names and from that day, they began to respect and mingle with them.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt: Never delay in sharing and experiencing the glory of God.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- **1.** Take note of salient points.
- 2. Do not hoard the message of God.
- **3.** Be obedient, guided and meditate on God's words.
- **4.** Learn to be humble, accommodating and attentive.
- **5.** Everyone in life is important, no matter their status.

Step 6: Task: Let children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Always show humility and respect to everyone you encounter and share the joyful news about the birth of Jesus.

Step 7: Memory Verse: beside Verse 17," When the shepherds saw him, they told them what the angel had said about the child."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

EPIPHANY OF THE LORD DATE: 08/01/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **GOD IS OUR GUIDE**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Matthew 2: 1-12**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

The custodian of frogs wanted to go out, he then instructs his frogs not to be lured by the pure whitish pot of milk looking captivating to them. They are to stay clear of the milk. But the two frogs turn a blind eye to his order and decide to go and see what it looks like and that was how they fell into the pot of milk. They started kicking frantically, looking for a way out, but the sides of the pot are slippery. Their custodian came back and met them in the pot of milk where they are struggling to come out. They are happy to see him because he will not abandon them but he'll help them out. The custodian advises them on what they are to do and how they are to do it so as to be saved. After several failed attempts, the frogs couldn't come out. But they keep trying and refuse to give up; they keep swimming, kicking, swimming, kicking.... Even though they are getting tired, they keep repeating the whole process, pressing on and following their custodians' guide. After a few hours, they find themselves sitting on sweet, creamy, butter! They've laboriously explored and now free at last.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt: God can never be deceived.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- **1.** God will always deliver us from evil (plot).
- **2.** Discern wisely and always follow instructions and warnings.
- **3.** The presence of God surely gives us joy.
- **4.** God's glory can manifest where we least expect.
- **5.** Persevere through adversity and remain obedient to God.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Always seek the Lord patiently in prayers and be obedient to His instruction to guide you through word of God, listening to the teachings of His Church and the wisdom of godly people.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 2, "... We saw his star when it came up in the east, and we have come to worship him."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME DATE: 15/01/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **RECOGNIZING GOD**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **John 1: 29 - 34**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

A king was to go for medical treatment abroad and customarily, the town shouldn't be left without a traditional head. It's mandatory for him to select someone to stand in for him before his return as he's still childless. He chose his friend to fill in this capacity until his return. It took the king years to come back because he needed to completely heal after his series of surgeries before flying down. His friend was dedicated and diligent and people really enjoyed his reign and loved him very well, such that they were beginning to forget their real king and seeing him as the real king. His friend also enjoyed the honour and privileges associated with royalty during this period. People already believed that as most people usually do

in this kind of instance, he would forget the arrangement and promise and he wouldn't want to leave the position for his friend upon his return because of the luxuries, loveshown him and the long period of time of his friend's absence. Therefore, they were ready to experience the drama that will unfold when the real king comes. But his friend was faithful and sincere, he knew he was just a caretaker, not a king. In fact, he announced the king's return to his people before his arrival and organized a befitting welcome party for him as far back as from the airport. To the surprise of many, he vacated the throne quietly and peacefully for his friend. The king was very delighted towards his friend for being loyal, he also never thought the transition could be this easy.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt:Do not experience the blessings of God alone, spread the good news to others.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. Promote your fellows, that won't stop your own glory.
- 2. Accept your inability and appreciate the ability in other people.
- 3. Everyone is endowed with different roles and talent, so don't be jealous of what you don't possess.
- 4. Be baptized (endorsed) by the Holy Spirit and embrace/accept God's call;
- 5. Trust and believe in God; He will never leave or forsake us; He already has everything planned and sorted before sending us on errands.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task:

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 29, "... There is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day for Him to bless it.

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME DATE: 22/01/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **DROP ALL**, **GOD IS CALLING YOU!**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Matthew 4: 12-23**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

The government arrested a vibrant human activist leader who always condemned and opposed the hardship faced by the citizens. While in the prison, he couldn't do much because he was already incapacitated. The government thought they had achieved their aim by silencing him and believed others would run into holes and caves for fear of avoiding same fate as he is. This was not the case, as other members led by the youngest woman amongst them, widely took up the advocacy by going from one place to another to avoid being nabbed. They advised the citizens not to fear the government, rather speak out and speak up, resist oppression and demand for an equitable surplus and a happy society. It's your right not for only their families, say no to a marginalized government at the expense of some people. Musicians, poets, writers, religious leaders and so on were all using their tools; such as songs, poems, literature texts, sermons, etc to pass the message across to the government, such that the government had no hiding place and frankly, how many people will they even arrest? It dawned on the governmentthat they needed to do something positive quickly before the citizens go wild or start revolting and incontrollable.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt: Nothing (especially trials) should hinder us from serving God.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. God can use anyone irrespective of status.
- **2.** Obey and trust God.
- 3. Nothing good comes easily, you have to look and work for it.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Tell your friends and everyone about Jesus and share His love by loving others and become fishers of friends (gathering more followers) for Jesus!

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 17, "... Turn away from your sins, because the Kingdom of heaven is near."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME DATE: 29/01/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **THE REWARD OF DOING GOD'S WILL**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: Matthew 5: 1-12a

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

Teachers are wonderful set of people, especially those at the primary and secondary schools' level. Beyond teaching, they settle disputes, nurse, preach and counsel, visit the sick and bereaved, nurture lives, provide for some basic needs, sometimes house their students etc still management, parents and guardians insult them, it's never easy but they never relent or give up, they keep moving and believing as it's usually said that; "Their rewards are great in heaven." Presently, teachers' rewards have started on earth as ex-students, parents, organizations and governments are rewarding outstanding teachers with gifts, cash, kind, promotions and awards. Indeed, teaching is such a noble profession! Be aware that there is nothing good done for humans in God's name that will be disregarded, unnoticed or unrewarded. Know that you are storing up. Therefore, do not relent!

Step 5: Lesson Learnt: Supply and nourish spiritually.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. If you know what others don't know, instruct and enlighten them on the subject.
- **2.** As a child of God, get ready for persecution but rejoice God will see you through.
- **3.** Tears may endure at night, but be assured eternal joy comes in the morning.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: The Beatitudes are blessings we receive when we have certain attitudes – Always display each day the attitudes of people who follow Jesus even if it brings some suffering – showing love and kindness to people, giving help to those in need, etc.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 6, "Happy are those whose greatest desire is to do what God requires; Is God will satisfy them fully!"

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

FEBRUARY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME DATE: 05/02/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **RADIATE GOD'S GLORY IN YOUR LIFE**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Matthew 5: 13-16**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

In a certain private school, a Mathematics teacher, Mr Chibuzor (popularly called MaziChibz.) was employed and he transformed all the departments in the school positively both academically and spiritually. He made impact and impart in the whole school. Both students and staff felt his presence. Step 5: Lesson Learnt:Do not underestimate your ability.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. Showcase your talent; do not hide it.
- 2. Be useful and impactful.
- 3. Stand out in the midst of the crowd

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Always exhibit to people around you, your God-given talents, love and presence and purity to impart on them for better.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 16, "... Your light must shine before people, so that they will see the good things you do and praise your Father in heaven."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME DATE: 12/02/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **ACT IN OBEDIENCE TO THE LAW**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Matthew 5: 17 - 37**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

Every organization has its laid down rules and regulations for people to abide with. This is to guide its workers, anyone faulting any of these rules will be dealt with in form of punishment, arrest, suspension or termination of appointment. - 3. Run away from every appearance of sin.
- 4. Change is constant, learn to adapt.
- 5. Do not swear no matter the condition.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Be eager to learn God's commandments from the Bible and Church teaching and always obey them.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 18, "Remember that as long as heaven and earth last, not the least point nor the smallest detail of the Law will be done away with – not until the end of all things."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME DATE: 19/02/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **DENOUNCE SATANAND HIS PROMISES**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Matthew 5: 38-48**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

Two men in the midst of some other people were personally having a discussion about a vacancy in an organization and the day for the interview. Apart from these two discussants, others never showed interest or joined in the conversation. Unknown to the discussants, one of those present was taking note of every single detail. Leaving that scene, he immediately called the person (the source) those two got the information from and snitched on others using the name of the man who disclosed the vacancy to get address, time and date of interview, requirement and every other thing that would be needed. They believed this was payback time but one of the two discussants let go and typed the recommendation letter for him and helped him collect all his entitlement as well.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt:Strive to do well always and obey the commandments.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. Be meek.
- 2. Love everyone equally and do not forget to pray for them.
- 3. Avoid discrimination, segregation and casting out.
- 4. Be outstanding and extraordinary; go beyond the ordinary and norms.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Always try to please the Lord by positive responses to your enemies such as sharing favorite toy with friend, inviting someone over that you struggle getting along with, saying something nice to a person who is usually mean to you, and praying for them.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 44, "...: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may become the children of your Father in heaven."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT DATE: 26/02/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week:**NO ONE IS ABOVE TEMPTATION**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **Matthew 4: 1-11**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

Once upon a time, some little fishes lived in a quiet pool near a river. Almost all of them were pleasant, friendly and lived and played very happily together. But one fish was different. He was not a big fish, but believed he was the biggest fish in that pool. He was proud of this and refused to be friendly with others. He complained and snapped about everything other fishes do. They told him since he was the 'biggest' fish he should go and join his mates in the river so that they would have peace and he wouldn't need to complain about their childish behaviours. He was already weighing the possibility of going to a higher (next level) water when he remembered they are trying to lure him to be destroyed and eaten by those bigger fishes in the river. He remembered the Yoruba adage "Ejaleja n je sanraniibu" (it is the smaller fish, the bigger fish feed on in the ocean). Thence, he was satisfied living with his pool mates and they lived peacefully and happily. He was subsequently, made the king of fishes and everything was going on unanimously and without hostility.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt: Weigh your options especially during difficult moments.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. Be spiritually prepared so as to overcome temptation, devil and his works.
- 2. Reject Satan so that God may reign in your heart (for both cannot live together).
- 3. There is always a cross before the crown, the road is not smooth or easy.
- 4. In time of trouble, not every solution appears favourable.
- 5. Be contented, avoid gluttony, greediness and pride/overconfidence.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task:Read the Bible regularly and fill yourself with the word for wisdom and God's guidance to be able to resist the temper or people who try to get us to do wrong.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 10, "... Go away, Satan! The Scripture says, 'Worship the Lord your God and serve only him!"

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

MARCH SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT DATE: 05/03/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week:**BEING WITH GOD IS PEACEFUL AND BEAUTIFUL**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: Matthew 17:1-9

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

The feelings one experiences when going for any spiritual exercise such as the Holy pilgrimage, vigils, masses, confessions can't be described. Worries, anxiety, sorrows will be forgotten and one will feel the peace and tranquility of God as long as one is at His presence. More significantly, is when you intercede for others at the altar so they could share in the blessings of God.

Janna went for a three-day revival programme in the church. She changed her regular Sunday seat and didn't sit with any of her friends because she wanted to concentrate and avoid disturbances. She was fully prepared for this spiritual exercise. On the last day they were to pray as the spirit leads. She channeled her prayers for her friends and families especially the sick and unconverted. She fervently prayed for them committing them and their needs unto God. She was so engrossed that she forgot her personal intention, although she had submitted her petitions on the first day of the revival. The Eucharist was exposed and she called on Mary mother of God, the angels and the saints to mediate on her behalf. She was just at peace with herself at that moment forgetting her own distress. As popularly said; "When you point a finger at someone, the other fingers are pointing back at you." Janna's prayers which she didn't even open her mouth to request were answered, all her troubles vanished within months of the revival. The prayer she made for her friends and families were also granted. For standing in gap for others, she and her people received their blessings.

Step 5: Lesson Learnt: Assuredly, our lives change positively and radiate when we are for God.

Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 1. Think of what will benefit others too, avoid selfishness.
- 2. Avoid distraction when communicating with God.
- 3. Spirit of God instructs and guides his own.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Try to be always in God's presence in order to share in His peace and be at peace with yourself bydoing good and pursing righteousness, talking the truth, loving God and loving people, caring for their needs, protecting them with your words, guarding your words about others, seeing people like God sees them, etc.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 5, "... This is my own dear Son, with whom I am pleased—listen to him!"

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT DATE: 12/03/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week:**DO NOT HIDE THE 'HURTING FINGER' UNDER THE CLOTHES**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **John 4:5-42**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

There was once a slave who was treated cruelly by his master. One day, he couldn't take it anymore and ran away to the forest to escape. There he chanced upon a lion that couldn't walk because of the thorn in its paw. Let three children identify some lessons from the message

- 2. Make requests, ask questions; do not be silent (you never know

when and who will help or has solution to the problem).

- 3. Nothing is hidden to God.
- 4. Truth and faith are essential ingredients of faith in order to get result.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Do good always and don't look down on or despise people or discriminate but instead offer help to them knowing that God remembers and rewards good deeds.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 10, "If only you knew what God gives and who it is that is asking you for a drink, you would ask him, and he would give you life-giving water."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

JOSEPH HUSBAND OF MARY DATE: 19/03/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week: **CHANGE YOURAPPROACH: AVOID RIGIDITY**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **John 9: 1-41**

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

- 4. God is not man, therefore, believe and have faith in Him, do not give up.
- 5. Be consistent and courageous, do not be intimidated in the face of adversary.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Trust God and never not trust Him to help you always believe Him at all costs that He can do anything for you.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 5, "While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT DATE: 26/03/2023

Opening Prayer: Let the teacher invite one of the children for the opening prayer.

Songs of Praise: The teacher ought to have planned for a hymn or choruses that fit the liturgy of the day.

Introduction: The teacher revises last week's discussion. Last memory verse will be repeated three times.

Step 1: The facilitator introduces the theme for the week:**GOD IS ALWAYSTIMELY**

Step 2: The Gospel reading of the Sunday will be read by two children: **John 11:** 1-45

Step 3: Sharing: Let children mention what they heard in the reading one after the other.

Step 4: Teaching: The facilitator will tell this story to enlighten children about the message of the Gospel of the day.

Step 6: Task: Let the children agree on a relevant and practicable task.

Suggested Task: Always take your problems to God seeking him by faith and trusting Him that there is nothing He cannot do even when the solution is not physically manifesting at your time.

Step 7: Memory Verse: Verse 5, "While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

Step 8: Sunday Offering: Let the teacher collect the Sunday offering to be taken to the church during the offertory.

Step 9: Concluding prayer: The session must be concluded with a prayer to be led by one of the children asking the child to use the topic of the day.
